Information: The Language Academy of Sacramento (LAS) remains steadfast in its commitment to fulfilling our charter mission. In the midst of the Covid-19 public health crisis, LAS will continue to pursue innovative ways and means to ensure that the three charter pillars: 1) Governance, 2) Academics, and 3) Business and Operations work efficiently and efficaciously in tandem, to address the ever-dynamic emerging needs of its constituents.

Governance Update:

Following Governor Newsom's issuance of Executive Order Number N-29-20 that has temporarily suspended some provisions in the Brown Act, LAS Governing Board meeting formats and schedules have occurred in the following ways:

- 1. Meeting formats: Hybrid of video, teleconferencing (with new provisions on agenda posting and public accessibility, specified in EO N-29-20 above), and/or live settings following social distancing protocols.
- 2. Meeting schedules: Regular monthly and/or emergency meetings

Academic Update:

Governance Decisions:

- March 13, 2020: LAS Board had an emergency meeting and voted for precautionary school closure from March 16-27, 2020.
- 2. March 19, 2020: LAS Board had an emergency meeting and voted to extend the precautionary school closure until April 10, 2020, the week after the scheduled spring break.

Implemented LAS Action Plan:

- Week of March 16: On Monday, March 16th, all LAS staff met and received LAS FAQ on Academic Planning during COVID-19 School Closure v031520. Agreements on big ideas: 1) Establishment of virtual office hours; 2) Preparation and distribution of academic review packets, both for General Education and Special Education students as well as exploration of online, distance learning platforms; 3) Continued whole-child support via Wellness Team check in with PE teachers, intervention staff, counselor, psychologist, and ASES staff.
- 2. Week of March 23: Monday 23rd and Tuesday 24th, School Leadership met via Zoom platform met with all staff in grade level cohorts and respective teams to address: 1) Individual Wellbeing Check in, 2) Student/Parent Contact: frequency and success rate, 3) Academic Learning or Wellness Check via modes of

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- communication and learning platforms: success and challenges. All staff is reminded to add questions and concerns to the LAS FAQ v031520 document.
- 3. Week of March 30 (To be implemented): School Leadership will continue all staff check in and heed to official state, local agencies, and LAS Board guidance in defining the status of the school closure timeline. In the meantime, LAS School Leadership will continue to research the strategies of neighboring districts and charter schools and simultaneously, fine-tune its innovative problem solving action plan under the motto, "Let's learn and thrive, together!"

Business and Operations Update:

1. Financial: Gov. Newson has committed to continuing funding for California Schools through the school closures. The California Department of Education plans to post a certification form (not posted as of when this was drafted on March 25, 2020) that is to be submitted as soon as possible after the COVID-19 emergency is over. Charter school administrators will submit a form certifying their dates of closure. Although the State urges districts/schools to meet compliance conditions throughout the closures (e.g., continue to offer high-quality educational opportunities, provide school meals, arrange for supervision of students, continue to pay employees) funding is **not** contingent upon meeting said conditions.

CDE will consider ADA from July 1, 2019-February 29, 2020 in lieu of the traditional apportionment reporting dates. The Language Academy of Sacramento average daily attendance (ADA) is 96.3% through this time period. This is 1% higher than budgeted in the 2019-2020 forecast. Additional considerations based on the varying timelines, include but should not be limited to, extended employee compensation and student access to technology.

As of March 25, 2020, experts do not have a clear indication of how out-years will be impacted. It would behove LAS to plan conservatively in future years (see feasibility study agenda item IVC)

- 2. Facilities: Pending core building project Project Bid and Considerations (To be discussed in detail in agenda item IVC)
- 3. Academic Calendar: *Pending CDC, Sacramento County Department of Public Health, and State Governor recommendations, LAS will resume classroom-based instruction for students as soon as possible.* Working under such premise, LAS Board and School Leadership will continue to engage on the academic calendar updates as new information evolves.

Recommendation: The Board deliberates on the presented and known COVID-19 crisis variables and if it deems, propose an action to address the LAS community needs at the time.

Total project budget is estimated at 4.7 million (including Alternate 1 - Learning walls).

Amidst the COVID-19 crisis, the Facilities Committee requests the Governing Board consider a number of important factors prior to moving forward with a final vote. Including, but not limited to,

Work Force Availability: Essential Services: On March 19, 2020 Governor Newson issued executive order N-33-20 establishing "Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers." Amongst this group under *Other Community-Based Government Operations and Essential Functions, Essential Workforce, Construction Workers who support the construction, operation, inspection, and maintenance of construction sites and construction projects (including housing construction).*

PNP Construction, has confirmed that both general and sub-contractors are committed to completing the project within the contracted time. Furthermore, should the Board approve and scheduling permit, PNP Construction would be willing to begin work as early as April 20, 2020.

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Construction Material Availability: PNP would like to request the LAS be open to material substitutions, of equal or greater value, in the given case that construction materials requested within the Project Manual are not available.

Timing: Estimated project completion is currently projected at 4.5 months from time of commencement. Given the loss of in-classroom instruction during the 2019-2020 school year the Board should consider program and space restrictions required to provide summer school and/or extended 2020-2021 academic year.

Funding: Total project cost is under the 5.5 million approved by the Governing Board and per the feasibility study LAS is able to afford the project without negatively impacting program quality or growth. However, due to the COVID-19, funding rates and COLA amounts are uncertain for out years. LAS is equipped to sustain two months of total expenses, however, after the construction project is completed LAS would have expensed a large portion of its reserves.

Recommendation: Committee feedback will be presented at the March 27, 2020 board meeting.



A. State amount to be added to provide a complete exterior stage area as indicated in Addendum 1.

2.6 ALTERNATE NO. 5: LIBRARY

A. State amount to be deducted for removal of C101 Library scope from the project. No work shall be done to this room with the exception of work required for complete and functioning electrical systems at other buildings in scope of work.

2.7 ALTERNATE NO. 6: UNIT D

A. State amount to be deducted for removal of Unit D modernization scope from project. No work shall be done to this building with the exception of work required for complete and functioning electrical systems at other buildings in scope of work.

1.5 DEFINITIONS

- A. Terms in this Section are those as defined in ASTM C 926 and ASTM C 1063, except as modified in this Section.

Backing Paper: Sheet membrane material (including kraft paper and non-paper material such as polyethylene and polyolefin) that provides a partial barrier against water and moisture intrusion through the portland cement plaster assembly, and provides a slip-sheet function that keeps the portland cement plaster assembly from bonding to the substrate, to limit random cracking of the finish.

Use connections that maintain structural value of joined pieces.
 - 1. Form items to required shapes and sizes, true to line and level with true curves and accurate angles and surfaces. Finish exposed surfaces to smooth, sharp, well-defined lines and arris.
 - 2. Form bent-metal corners to smallest radius possible without causing grain separation or otherwise impairing work.
 - Form simple and compound curves in bars and extruded shapes by bending members in jigs to produce uniform curvature for each configuration required; maintain cross section of member throughout entire bend without buckling, twisting, cracking, or otherwise deforming exposed surfaces.
 - 4. Cut, drill, and punch metals cleanly and accurately.
 - a. Remove burrs and ease edges to a radius of approximately 1/32 inch, unless otherwise noted.
 - b. Remove sharp or rough areas on exposed surfaces.
 - 5. Mill joints to a tight, hairline fit.
 - a. Cope or miter corner joints.
 - b. Fabricate connections that will be exposed to weather in a manner to exclude water.
 - 6. Provide weep holes where water may accumulate.
 - 7. Provide factory finish, unless otherwise noted.

2.8 MIXING

- A. General: Site mix cement plaster mixtures without silo delivery in accordance with ASTM C 926 and the following:
 - 1. Mix mill-mixed plaster in accordance with the manufacturer's written instructions.
 - 2. Size batches for complete use within maximum of one-hour after mixing.
 - 3. Re-temper plaster stiffened from evaporation, but do not use or re-temper partially hydrated cement plaster.
 - Do not use caked or lumping materials.
 - 5. Mix materials dry, to uniform color and consistency, before adding water. Use minimum amount of water that will produce a workable consistency
 - 6. Use moist, loose sand in mix proportions.
 - 7. Withhold 10-percent of mixing water until mixing is almost complete, then add as needed to produce necessary consistency.
 - 8. Protect mixtures from freezing, frost, contamination, and excessive evaporation.
- B. Mechanical Mixing:

- 1. Clean mixer of set or hardened materials before loading for new batch.
- 2. Maintain mixer in continuous operation while adding materials.
- 3. Conform to mixing sequence and time recommended by manufacturer of plaster materials.
- C. Hand Mixing: Hand mixing of materials is not permitted.
- D. Mix Proportions by Volume: As specified in ASTM C 926 for plaster thickness indicated.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

3.1 COORDINATION

A. Coordinate with framing installation to ensure provision of framing members and blocking in locations required control joints.

3.2 EXAMINATION

- A. Examine areas and substrates with installer present and verify that substrate conditions are acceptable and ready to receive lathing and plastering work. Correct conditions detrimental to the proper and timely performance of this work before proceeding with installation. Commencement of work indicates acceptance of substrates.
 - Framed Substrates: Verify that sheathing, weather barriers, continuous insulation and flashings specified in related Sections are complete and ready to receive work of this Section.

3.3 PREPARATION

- A. Protect adjacent work from soiling, spattering, moisture deterioration, and other harmful effects caused by plastering.
- B. Prepare smooth, solid substrates or those that do not have the suction capability required to bond with plaster in accordance with ASTM C 926.
 - 1. Apply bonding compound suitable for exterior exposure of solid surfaces in accordance with manufacturer's written instructions.

3.4 BACKING PAPER INSTALLATION

- A. Install two layers of backing paper in weatherlap fashion per manufacturer's recommendations, using Single-Separate Layer method as described in the Building Code.
 - 1. First Layer: Tyvek CommercialWrap® D.
 - 2. Second Layer: Two-Ply Super Jumbo Tex® 60 Minute.

- B. Extend first layer over the sill plate / curb interface, foundation weep screed, and designated drainage screeds, and as shown. Install full height of wall to underside of roof overhang or soffit framing.
- C. Install second layer of backing paper over first layer as an intervening layer (slip sheet bond breaker).
- D. Both layers of backing paper:
 - 1. Lap at horizontal control joints, and as shown.
 - 2. Run continuously behind vertical control joints.
- E. Omit backing paper layers at horizontal soffits, provide metal lath at this condition with integral paper backing.
- F. Polyethylene or Polyolefin Sheet Backing Paper:
 - 1. Only apply seam tape at vertical joints. Do not apply seam tape at horizontal joints.
 - 2. UV Exposure: Backing paper to be covered within 9 months (270 days) of installation.
- G. Asphalt-Saturated Kraft Backing Paper:
 - Do not apply seam tape at vertical or horizontal joints.
 - 2. UV Exposure: Backing paper to be covered as soon as possible.
- H. Attachment of Backing Paper: Attach backing paper first and second layers in accordance with manufacturer's installation guidelines.
 - 1. Provide fastener penetration into studs.
 - 2. Use manufacturer's recommended fastener type for applicable substrate.
- I. Damaged Areas of Backing Paper: Seal holes, tears, breaks or punctures with manufacturer's recommended sealant or tape per manufacturer's written instructions.

3.5 LATHING INSTALLATION

- A. General: Install lathing in accordance with ASTM C1063, CBC Sections 2504 and 2507, Table 2507.2, and additional requirements specified in this Section.
 - 1. Install lathing taut, using self-furring and self-gasketing fasteners, with long dimension perpendicular to supports, over sheathing and water-resistive barrier at walls and over ceiling framing at soffits, as indicated.
 - 2. Attach lathing to framing members at not more than 7 inch intervals conforming to requirements of ASTM C 1063 so that fasteners occur where sides of lathing lap at vertical framing members.
 - 3. Use specified screws for lathing attachment at wood framing.
 - 4. Provide required minimum penetration of fasteners into framing members.

- 5. Reinforce internal and external corners with continuous lath. Continue lathing through corner to next framing member, one stud bay minimum beyond corner.
- 6. Insert lathing as far as possible into reentrant space of metal frames, and notch to pass around jamb anchors.
- 7. Seal splices, intersections, and terminations of lathing accessories watertight.

3.6 LATHING ACCESSORIES INSTALLATION

- A. General: Install lathing accessories in accordance with ASTM C1063, and additional requirements specified in this Section.
 - 1. Set lathing accessories plumb, level, and true to line. Shims are not allowed. Adjust key attachment flanges where necessary to align grounds. Miter at corners. Accurately and tightly fit exposed joints.
 - 2. Install metal accessories using longest possible lengths no termination of a length of section occurring within 24 inches of an intersecting length of section.
 - Terminate vertical joints above horizontal drainage screeds and horizontal drainage flashings. Carefully align splice end joints of lathing accessories for accurate alignment.
 - 4. Fasten, wire-tie, screw, or nail lathing accessories into framing members sufficiently to hold accessories in place during plastering, unless otherwise indicated.
 - 5. Discontinue lathing at control joints. Continuous lathing installation through control joints is not permitted. The weather barrier shall be continuous through control joints. Stop lathing, attach lathing edges to framing member, and wire-tie to expanded sheet metal attachment flanges of control joint lathing accessories. Do not fasten expanded sheet metal attachment flange of control joint lathing accessories to substrate.
 - 6. Install ground of lathing accessories to true lines, plumb, level, and straight, within 1/8 inch in 10 feet planar tolerance.
 - 7. Install lathing accessory grounds to provide specified nominal thickness of plaster and to bring plaster surface to required plane.
 - Coordinate, trim or cope screeds and accessories to lap or be lapped with flashings and work provided by other Sections. Ensure laps of accessories, backing paper, weather barrier and flashings shed moisture to exterior, and are sealed water tight.
 - 9. Ease exposed metal corners and sharp edges.
 - 10. Control Joint Locations: Provide at locations indicated.
 - 11. Control Joints: Install control joints in walls in accordance with building code and ASTM C1063, and at locations indicated on drawings.
 - 12. Touch-up paint finishes as required.

B. Foundation Weep Screeds:

1. Install foundation weep screeds at bottom of walls to receive lath and plaster.

- 2. Place the bottom edge of the foundation weep screed not less than 1 inch below the joint formed by the foundation and framing, and as shown.
- 3. Place the ground of the screed not less than 4 inches above raw earth.
- 4. Place the ground of the screed not less than 2 inches above paved surfaces.
- 5. Do not seal backing papers to the screed, leave the bottom of backing papers open to drain.
- C. Casing Beads: Isolate non-load bearing members from load bearing members and penetrating elements, including window, door, and opening frames, with casing beads to avoid transfer of structural loads and to separate from dissimilar materials.
 - 1. Use single length of casing beads wherever length of run does not exceed longest standard stock length available; miter or cope corners.
 - 2. Set casing beads level, plumb, and true to line, and align joints with concealed splices or tie plates. Shims are not allowed.
 - Install casing beads at cement plaster edges, wherever plaster abuts against another material, at the following locations listed below and elsewhere as indicated on Drawings.
 - a. Where plaster abuts dissimilar construction.
 - At perimeter of openings where edges of plaster will not be concealed by other work.
 - c. At perimeter of openings where a sealant bead is required.
 - d. Install to provide a minimum 3/8 inch clearance between structural units and termination points of surfaces that receive plaster finish, to accommodate sealant.

3.7 CEMENT PLASTER APPLICATION - WOOD

- A. General: Install portland cement-based plaster in accordance with ASTM C 926 and applicable ICC-ES reports for approved products.
 - 1. Plaster System Thickness:

B. Machine-mix for three (3) minutes but never more than five (5) minutes – do not overmix. Clean machine mixer following each batch. Use only freshly mixed materials in good condition.

- 1. Re-tempering (adding water to dilute a curing and stiffened mix) is not permitted.
- C. Apply cement plaster by hand or machine spray. Machine application requires approval from Architect. If machine applied, use only machine applicator foreman and nozzleman with minimum five years experience.
- D. Control plaster system thickness and surface evenness using grounds or screeds. Use temporary screeds or plaster screeds within plastered areas to supplement fixed grounds and screeds. Finish surfaces smooth and even within tolerance of 1/8 inch in 10 feet from true plane.
- E. Scratch Coat: Install scratch coat in specified thickness with sufficient material to form secure keys, completely embed the lath, and to allow for scoring of cement plaster surface. Lightly score scratch coat horizontally to provide mechanical key for brown coat. Continuously moist cure scratch coat for 48 hours (2 days) minimum before applying brown coat. Cover with polyethylene sheets to retard evaporation during extreme heat or windy conditions.
- F. Brown Coat: Install brown coat in specified thickness, over damp scratch coat. Brown Coat to be flat with 1/8 inch per 10 feet, one way. Apply a fine spray of clean water to cured scratch coat, so as to dampen only. Do not saturate. Allow sheen to disappear before applying the brown coat. Apply brown coat with sufficient material and pressure to ensure a tight uniform bond to scratch coat. Continuously moist cure Brown Coat, for 48 hours (2 days) minimum. Cover with polyethylene sheets to retard evaporation during extreme heat or windy conditions.
 - 1. Curing of the brown coat starts after the first wetting, after the final set of the plaster, when the plaster is hard enough to moist cure.
- G. Cement Plaster Finish Coat: No sooner than 28 days after proper application and curing of brown coat, apply Cement Plaster Finish Coat to damp brown coat substrate in 1/8 inch minimum nominal thickness. Apply to match sample as approved by Architect. Do not moist cure stucco finish coat except in severe climatic conditions such as extreme heat, strong winds, and low relative humidity; as moist curing may cause discoloration.
 - 1. Verify the brown coat substrate is structurally sound, clean, dry, free of efflorescence and that the pH level is below 10.
 - 2. Verify ambient temperature is at least 40 deg F and rising during application and at least 24 hours after application.
 - 3. Remove and repair loose, deteriorated substrate. Clean dusty surfaces to ensure adhesion of finish.
 - Remove surface contaminants by wire brush, pressure washing or sandblasting.
 - 5. Remove efflorescence using a diluted muriatic acid wash and rinse thoroughly.
 - 6. Finish Coat: Apply with sufficient material and pressure to ensure a tight bond with the brown coat / base coat. Apply in uniform thickness to required depth, with consistent finish.

- a. Wet Edge: Maintain a wet edge so that finish will not be allowed to set up in the middle of a wall. Apply finish continuously along wall until an external or internal corner is reached.
- b. Immediately following the application, use trowels or floats as required to achieve desired finish texture to match approved samples.
- c. Additives: No additives will be allowed.
- d. Operations: Employ sufficient manpower and scaffolding to provide continuous operation and uniform appearance.
- e. Protect from rain and excessive moisture until finish coat has set and cured.
- 7. Do not paint or allow finish coat to be painted within 30 days of application of finish coat.
- H. Sealant: At weather-exposed conditions to keep cement plaster assemblies watertight and weatherproof or to meet STC ratings for wall assemblies indicated, seal joints between edges of plasterwork and abutting construction with appropriate sealant specified in related Section. Do not seal weeps or obstruct weep holes.

3.8 DEFECTIVE WORK

A. Repair or replace defective work and eliminate functional and visual defects. Defective work includes dry-set, sweat-out, buckles, loose plaster, exposed lath, popping or pitting caused by defective materials, damage caused to unprotected fresh plaster, cracking, checks, pits, discoloration and other similar defects. Match texture and finish of patched areas to adjacent work.

3.9 FIELD QUALITY CONTROL

- A. Curing Observation: The plaster system applicator is responsible for the proper curing of the plaster system as described and required by these specifications.
 - 1. The applicator is required to keep a log, which accurately documents the intervals (by time of day and date, and weather conditions) that the cement plaster system is moistened with water spray. The log is made available to the Project Inspector and verified on a daily basis during the work of this Section. Submit the completed log as a Closeout Submittal.

3.10 CLEANING AND PROTECTION

A. At completion of work, clean plaster from beads, screeds, metal base, metal trim, adjacent finishes, equipment and walkways.

B. Protect plasterwork against damage from construction operations during the remainder of construction period.

2.3 SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

A. Design: Modular woof and laminate shelving system using starter and adder design.

2.4 BASIC COMPONENTS

- A. All vertical uprights of shelving shall be 1-inch thick veneer core plywood, "A" grade, red oak or maple and shall be faced with 0.050-inch thick high pressure laminate on both faces. End units shall receive wood
- B. Starter sections will have two vertical uprights and will be 37-inchesin total width. Shelf pin holes shall be 8mm in diameter and shall be bored on 32mm centers on the inside of each end panel.
- C. Adder section shall have one vertical upright and will be 36-inches in total width. Holes shall be bored on 32mmcenters on both sides of the adder panel with the same configuration as end panels.
- D. Playpods to be constructed per shelving standards and contain upholstered cushions on all sides of the seating / plan areas.

2.5 SHELVES AND ACCESSORIES

- A. All flat shelves to be kiln dried 3/4-inch thick solid red oak or maple glued-up strips of no less than 3/4-inch wide and no more than 2-inch wide, and free from structural defects.
- B. All display shelves will be 3/4-inch think and shall be faced with 0.050-inch thick high-pressure laminate and receive a solid red oak or maples retaining edge.

- C. Shelf pins will be 5/16-inch in diameter and 1-inch in length and shall fit into the upright using the smooth side. The flange prevents the shelf pin from being dislodged and reduces the shelf pin sagging. The underside of the shelves shall be machined with slots to fit over the threaded end and flange portion of the shelf pins to prevent them from accidentally dislodging.
- D. Top frames shall be 35-inches wide by the depth of the shelving specified and constructed of red oak or maple veneer plywood with a cornice board that is 3/4" x 2-1/8" x 35". The top surface shall be faced with 0.050-inch high pressure laminate. The laminated top shall be captured by the cornice board and sit 1/4-inch below the edge band of the upright.
- E. All shelving shall be a 1/4-inch thick red oak or maple veneered plywood back panel. Back panels of single-faced shelving shall be fully finished on one side, and panels of double-faced shelving shall be fully finished on two sides. Backs will slide into a groove machined into the uprights.
- F. Cushions shall be 3-inch thick upholstered foam cushions.

2.6 FINISH

- A. Finishes to be selected by Architect from manufacturer's full range of standard colors.
 - 1. All exposed wood to be sanded and free of machine marks, excess glue, scratches, and/or other imperfections.
 - 2. Plastic laminate shall be 0.050" high pressure laminate and shall comply with NEMA ID-3, Grade GP-50. One 'Main' and up to four "Accent" colors to be selected from manufacturers full range of standard and custom finishes.
 - 3. All fabric shall comply with California Tech Bulletin 117, section E and have a minimum abrasion of 100,000 double rubs.
- B. UV Finish: Each part to go through a six-step finishing process. Top coat to be highly resistant to abrasion scuffing, sunlight, boiling water, alcohol, nail polish remover, mustard/ketchup, tea, ink, soft drinks, and juices.

2.7 FABRICATION

A. Fabricate work in shop to greatest extent possible before application of finishes. Remove sharp and rough edges and corners from cut wood and sand smooth. Design components, joints and connections to withstand most severe possible loading condition, with normal safety factor.

2.8 SEISMIC REQUIREMENTS

A. Overhead bracing and bracing between stacks will not be permitted. Stacks shall be braced only to the concrete floor below.

- B. Shelving shall be designed and anchored to resist lateral seismic forces equal to 30 percent of the weight of rack plus contents, assumed to act in the direction of each of the main axes of the rack.
- C. Contents shall be assumed to weigh a minimum of 50 pounds per square foot of shelf.
- D. A maximum of 85 percent of the weight of the rack plus contents shall be assumed to resist overturning moments.

REFLECTED CEILING PLAN A6.1.1 B








FLOOR PLAN - LIGHTING - UNIT A

What is the 2nd Interim report?

The 2^{nd} interim report is a follow up of the 1^{st} interim that was submitted in December. This is the 2^{nd} update that the district and county have received regarding LAS financials. The financials include the cash flow, balance sheet, and the income statement. Digital and hard copies of the report were submitted to the district as of March 13^{th} 2020.

What data has been submitted and what are we approving?

The report is essentially the January financials that were presented to the board, but input into the template that the district requires. The 2nd Interim financials have been attached for your review in the usual format that I provide in the board meetings. Please review these financials as they are the figures that were submitted in the 2nd interim template.

The only data that is included in the 2nd interim report that is not part of the January financials are the 2021 and 2022 forecasts. These amounts are just an estimate of future years and have not been finalized (this will be done in the budget submission in June). The approval that is required in the board meeting does not lock in future year budgets, but it does more firmly apply to actuals and current the current year budget. Once we have finalized 2021 figures, I will be presenting these to the board most likely in the April board meeting.

What does the district/county do with these reports?

Historically, we have not received much follow up from the district in the form of questions or concerns. However, more recently, I have seen a shift from authorizers of multiple schools to reviewing the information and asking questions. There have been some instances of letters being sent to the school with these concerns, but mostly these letters contain inquiries and questions related to the assumptions made in the financials. I do not anticipate any questions from the district or county regarding the LAS report, but if there are any questions, I will be able to assist in answering any questions they might have.
