- LAS DiLe Plan: Frequently Asked Question (FAQs) for Families: Here you will find a list of FAQs highlighting what the start to the new school year will be like for our students. It can also be found on the LAS website.
- Materials Distribution Days: If you were unable to pick up your child's materials and/or tech device for Distance Learning, please stop by the LAS office between the hours of 7.30am-4pm to pick them up.

- School Schedule: Our daily start times remain the same as always, Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten (8:30am), and 1st 8th (8:00am).
- Teacher Office Hours: Now that we have begun the school year, we want to make clear that teachers have established office hours from 2:15-2:45pm from Monday through Thursday.
- Acceptable Use of Technology: Please be sure to review with your child the <u>acceptable</u> use of LAS technology
- Immunizations: All students are required to meet CA immunization requirements. You can find a list of required immunizations for Kindergarten and 7th grade here.
- Meals: LAS is offering curbside meal pick ups. You can find the September menu here.
- Zoom: If you have not yet completed the Zoom Permission Form, an office staff member will be in contact with you soon. You can review it here.
- Health and Safety Procedures: If you need to visit the LAS office during Distance Learning, please be sure to wear a mask at all times and follow social distancing protocols. The office is open Monday-Friday from 7.30am-4pm.
- LCFF: Several years ago, the State of California changed the way they fund school districts and independent charters. As such, schools like ours now receive additional funding for students whose families meet certain income eligibility requirement set by the state and federal government. The data on the applications will help us collect essential Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) data so that our students can benefit from the additional state funding. You should've completed this form when you received your Beginning of the Year packet. If you have not yet completed it, an office staff member will be in contact with you soon.
