## Parent Pre-Screening At Home

Children should stay home when not feeling well. People with the below symptoms may have COVID-19 and should get tested:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue or Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat/
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea



# Teacher Pre-Screening

Teacher will also assist in pre-screening students for symptoms. All classrooms have been provided with thermometers.



Students that are experiencing symptoms:

- will have to wait at least 24 hours have passed since the child's fever has stopped without the use of fever-reducing medications;
- other symptoms have improved;
- the child should have a negative test for COVID-19, OR a healthcare provider has provided documentation of an alternative named diagnosis (such as (e.g., allergies or asthma) strep throat, pharyngitis),
- OR at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset.



# Masks Face coverings

### Narrative

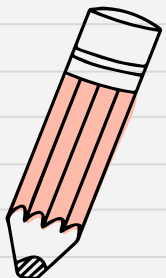
A descriptive story about a small moment in your life

### Informative

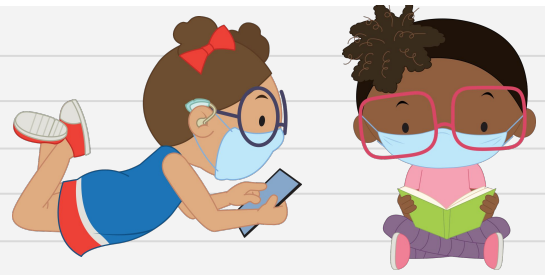
Teach the reader information about a topic

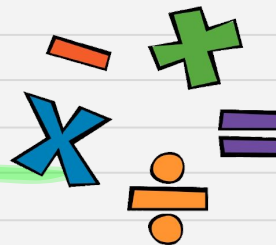
